Our robust holiday programming continued to flourish with amazing partnership participation. Programming counts showed increased needs and recurring demand from month to month as we continued to provide food boxes and daily meals.

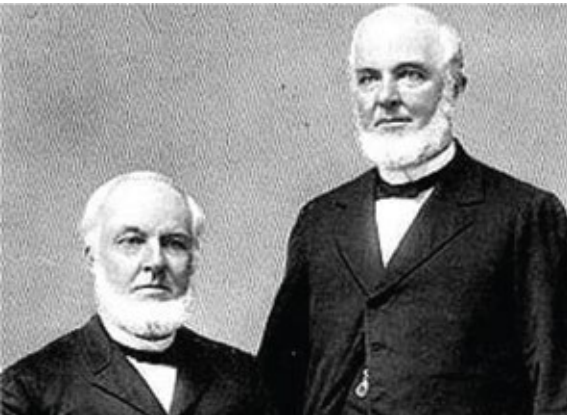
125 YEARS OF HISTORY

- 1898** ♥ Founded by Alfred Smiley during a public meeting called by the Minister's Association. Smiley was elected as the first president and the original name of the agency was Associated Charities of Redlands. In its early years, Family Service had few paid staff; it was a membership program with members paying no less than 25 cents each month. Each member of the Associated Charities was a volunteer case worker, appointed a "visitor" by the Executive Committee, and went out into the community to attend to the ill and destitute. The board met weekly and cases were presented and the committee decided which cases to fund. From the very beginning the agency offered "a hand up, not just a hand out."
- 1904** ♥ The first employee, Mrs. Van de Carr was hired for the joint mission of acting as a "visiting missionary" to clients and collecting contributions from donors. She later became the organization's first executive. She served the organization for 32 years.
- 1906** ♥ Associated Charities became incorporated and the first office opened in Mrs. Van De Carr's home at 18 East Fern Avenue.
- 1909** ♥ Associated Charities opened a wood yard to provide jobs for unemployed men. Those employed were paid 15 cents an hour, paid out in "tickets" redeemable for food and lodging. The wood was offered for sale to the public.
- 1910** ♥ The first visiting nurse was hired.
- 1914** ♥ The organization received a bequest in the amount of \$1,000; this was the beginning of our endowment fund. This fund, at the end of 2013 was valued at more than one million dollars.
- 1919** ♥ The first Thanksgiving Baskets, as we know them today, were given.
- 1927** ♥ The original building on the Lawton Street site was built for The House of Neighborly Service as part of a state-wide program started by the Presbyterian Church.
- 1929** ♥ The visiting nurse was seeing 250-300 cases per month.
- 1932** ♥ Eldridge Lyon, the donor of the Lyon Wing to A.K. Smiley Public Library, donated Family Service's first building, at 114 Vine Street. The building originally served as Redlands' first hospital. Mrs. Van de Carr established a Well Baby Clinic at the new location.
- 1938** ♥ Mrs. Van de Carr retired and Miss Dorothy Freeman was hired as the new Executive.
- 1939** ♥ The Christmas Shop was formally organized and coordinated by volunteers.
- 1942** ♥ Mrs. Viola Hesser became Executive and dealt with the many societal problems that came with the war years.
- 1947** ♥ Redlands Chamber of Commerce began plans to form a City Council of Social Agencies. In October this group became known as the Community Chest. In the 1970's, Community Chest became The United Way.
- 1948** ♥ Associated Charities changed its name to Family Service Association to reflect the social service nature of the work done by the agency. Mrs. Hesser retired and Lucille Older was hired to become the 4th Director.
- 1967** ♥ After 50 years of service, the visiting nurse program was cancelled when State certification requirements changed.
- 1968 - 1969** ♥ A full-time office secretary (Beulah Payne) was hired and FSA started a counseling service during this time. At one time, Family Service had four counselors on staff. The counseling service continued until the early 90's, when FSA made the decision to contract with Citrus Counseling Service – a partnership that continues today.
- 1974** ♥ Family Service asked the Community Chest for permission to have a drive for additional funds. This first FSA campaign letter brought in \$6,000.
- 1977** ♥ Lucille Older, now Lucille Martin, retired and after a couple months with Ardis Enright as director, Family Service hired Betty Figueroa to run the agency. She was the sixth director and the first bi-lingual staff member.

OUR HISTORY (Cont.)

- 1990** ♥ The Presbytery of Riverside, who had run the House of Neighborly Services program and owned the Lawton Street property, agreed to lease it to Family Service for \$1.00 a year.
- 2014** ♥ Cheryl Heesen retires as Executive Director after 16 years of service. Kyra Stewart becomes the 11th Executive Director in the agency's history.
- 2015** ♥ Summer Nutrition Program began. In partnership with the Department of Education, Family Service began offering healthy lunches to local school children who received free lunch during the school year.

- 2016** ♥ The Yucaipa Outreach Program office opened. Partnerships with the city of Yucaipa and Redlands Community Hospital were key to making this a reality.
- 2023** ♥ Family Service Association of Redlands celebrates 125 years of service to the community. Housing, food, wrap around support and education that strengthen families remain the focus.





HOUSING ASSISTANCE

Housing and stabilization for families in crisis are at the forefront of what Family Service accomplishes in its safety net programming. We recognize that health and housing go directly hand in hand and you truly cannot have one without the other.

In 2023, San Bernardino County (Office of Homeless Services Point in Time count) showed a 25.9 percent growth in homeless counts. Rents continued to be the most expensive in the nation according to the Public Policy Institute of California.

Studies continue to show that Californians spent disproportionate shares of their income on housing causing extreme cost burdened monthly situations. Low income households were affected the most by rising costs especially for families with children and elderly disabled on fixed incomes.

Further complicating the situation, the National Low Income Housing Coalition published a report (NLIHC.org) showing a 972,083 deficit of affordable rental homes available for extremely low income renters.

With this knowledge over the past few years - Family Service took action and started to proactively strengthen our housing program by pursuing additional government contracts and beginning a Strategic Plan process that focused on becoming a stronger bridge between the families we served and the housing resources available in the state of California.

TACKLING FOOD INSECURITY AND HUNGER ONE MEAL AND ONE BOX AT A TIME

An astounding **16,450** meals were served to the community in 2023 because of **YOUR SUPPORT**. The Daily Nutritional Program at Family Service provides a hot meal on the Redlands Campus open to the community during weekday mornings. The accessibility to the meal is easy and hassle free and many who attend are unhoused, in the process of finding resources, or low-income families with children. Our volunteers work diligently each day to assist in the preparation of the hearty meal and partners like the Bishop Store House, individual donors and faith-based entities assist in assuring Family Service has the capacity to serve day-in and day-out.

The drive through Food Box program provided **1,702** boxes of food to hundreds of families throughout the year 2023. Participants enter our parking lot once a month for a box of emergency food after signing up online beforehand.

We appreciate partners like the Eastside Christian Church, Gift Card Bank program, Stater Bros Charities, Inland Harvest and the Church of Jesus Christ and the Latter-Day Saints for assisting in providing food items needed to administer this important service.

The preparation of the drive through food boxes requires foresight, organization, and planning. With the help of amazing volunteers and donors, Family Service provides vital food items to assist families in providing healthy options to cure hunger or food insecurity in the home. With the current cost of food, hardworking families often must choose between paying a utility bill or buying food. Family Service is diligent in providing safety net resources to HELP others in need.

REDLANDS HUNGER WALK

The Redlands Hunger Walk was held on the University of Redlands campus in June. It was one of the most highly attended years, with Terry and Geneil Vines leading the event. Nearly 350 walkers turned out to support critical food assistance and nutritional support programs. FSA is gearing up for the 10th Annual Redlands Hunger Walk on Saturday, June 1, 2024. It is expected to be another successful year with the addition of runners to the event.



DINNER IN THE GROVE

In September, the Annual Dinner in the Grove event delighted 500 guests with a gourmet dinner, wine, & silent auction under the stars in a historic orange grove owned by Jack & Laura Dangermond.

The event sold out in record time and received rave reviews from those in attendance. Each year, Dinner in the Grove subsidizes general operating expenses for FSA helping the organization to continue to provide necessary services to the community.

The 20th Annual Dinner in the Grove will be held Saturday, September 28, 2024, with creators and co-chairwomen Char Burgess and Shelli Stockton at the helm. This year's Dinner in the Grove will feature everyone's favorite aspects of the event plus some added features to celebrate the 20th anniversary.



Throughout the year, other fundraising efforts and contributions helped FSA meet challenges and fund vital services such as community food boxes, housing, and client programming. 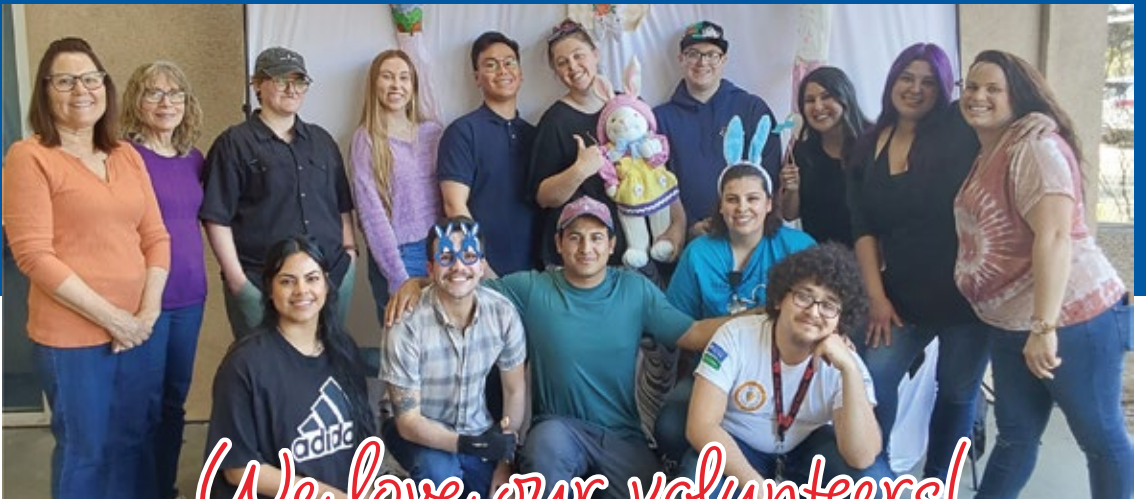

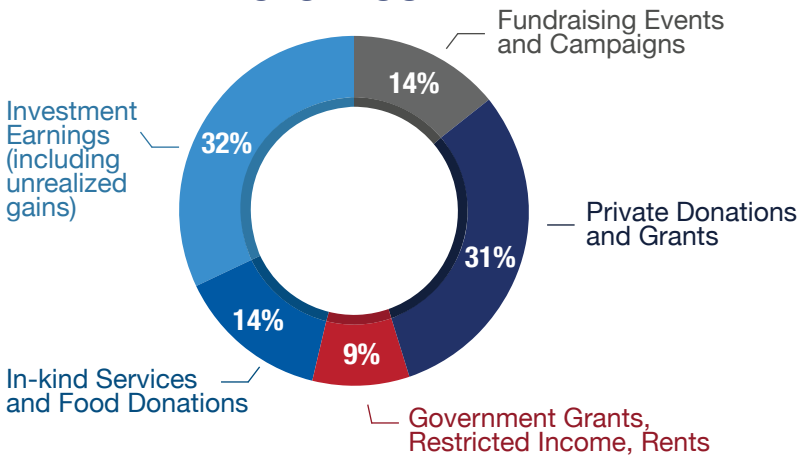

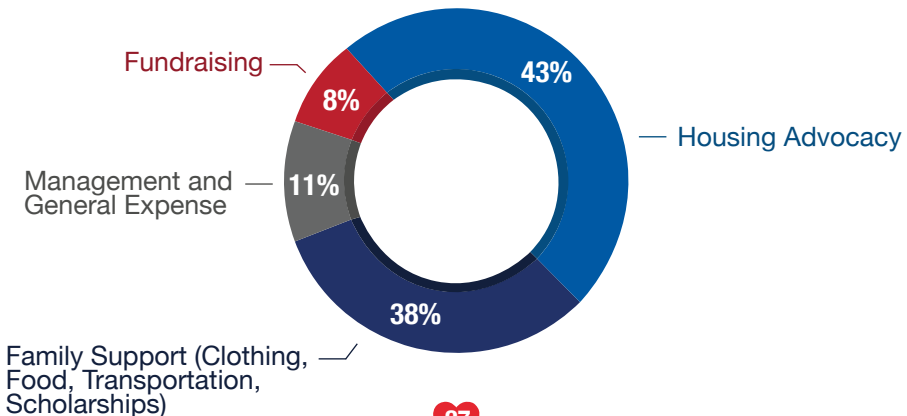
